

The 2017 book by Richard Rothstein on the history of racial segregation in the United States. The author argues that intractable segregation in America is the byproduct of explicit government policies at the local, state, and federal levels, and not happenstance. Among other discussions, the book provides a history of subsidized housing and discusses the phenomenons of white flight, blockbusting, and racial covenants, and their role in housing segregation.


Seattle On The Line: Examining the History & Contemporary Impact of Redlining
